Judgment

After deliberating and considering the circumstances of the case, i.e. the coronary artery bypass surgery that the brother of Petitioner 1 underwent, and an additional operation he is scheduled to undergo in the coming days, the Respondents agreed to allow the entry of Petitioner 1 and his minor son, Petitioner 3, into Israel for passage to Gaza to visit the patient. This differs from the matter of Petitioner 2, who does not meet the criteria set in the procedure. We recommended to the Petitioners to accept the aforesaid and they agreed. The petition is dismissed. Details of the passage will be settled by the Respondents as soon as possible. We wish the brother of the Petitioner a speedy recovery.
