Judgment

Counsel for the State has notified that she has not changed her fundamental position according to

which visitation for the families of persons removed under the agreement in the Church of

Nativity affair shall be permitted, but that this position is contingent on circumstances. Residents

of the Area are currently not permitted passage for the purpose of meetings in Gaza, due to the

particularly tense situation in Gaza at this time, following the military operation. This preclusion

also applies to visits for the reasons requested here, of providing an opportunity for a wife and

children to meet with the head of the family who is currently in Gaza as a result of a forced

measure.

Passage to the Gaza Strip is presently prevented, yet, obviously, this matter is contingent on

circumstances and at the present time, humanitarian permits for passage of the requested sort

have been greatly reduced. In view of the small number of permits granted at this time due to the

circumstances in the Area, we have found no cause to intervene in granting the relief sought by

the Petitioners, although we are aware of the difficult position in which a family that is prevented

from meeting with the husband and father finds itself. One can presume that if and when a

change occurs in the security situation in this context, or if the policy which stems from the

situation changes, a possibility of passage for the purpose of a meeting between the minor

children and their father will be provided.

Therefore, the petition is denied.
