Joint Motion for Dismissal without Prejudice

The parties to the petition hereby submit a motion on consent to withdraw the petition as follows:

1. The petition concerns the request of Petitioner 7 to “allow petitioners 1-6 and every Palestinian from the West Bank, whose application for family unification ... in Israel was approved, and who resides in Jerusalem neighborhoods located on the east side of the separation fence, near Shu'fat Refugee Camp, to travel to the west side of the fence through the checkpoint which is located near Shu'fat Refugee Camp.... without any restrictions or conditions”.
2. The respondent respectfully submits that at this time it has been decided to allow passage through the Shu'fat checkpoint to anyone who holds a DCO permit for entry into Israel granted as part of an approved family unification application. In light of this, this petition has been resolved from the practical aspect and, therefore, the parties request that the Honorable Court order its dismissal without prejudice.
3. It must be emphasized, that all of the parties' arguments are reserved.

4. In view of the above, the Honorable Court is requested to order the dismissal of the petition without prejudice.
