B7. Pursuant to the family unification procedure, there are about 9,900 requests in which a
'referral to a DCO' type approval was given for receiving a permit of stay in Israel

- a. Of them, 4,508 are men sponsors, and 5,392 woman.
- b. 247 minors are staying with a DCO permit.
- c. Of the requests in Section B7, the "invited" are Judea and Samaria residents.
- d. Of the requests in Section B7, the "invited" is a Gaza Strip resident in 327 requests.

B8. The number of people who are staying in Israel under a temporary residency visa type A/5 in the framework of family unification is 12,309.

B9a. Of them 9,121 requests the sponsor is male and in 2,818 requests the sponsor is female (the total in this Section is higher than the total in Section B9 [sic], because the data in Section B9 was extracted from the number of requests, whereas in this section the data was extracted from the list of "sponsors" in the request file, and in certain requests it was discovered that more than one sponsor had been updated.

B9b. The data for this section cannot be extracted given that the data in Section B8 was extracted from the request file's decision field, i.e., it shows the number of requests on which the decision was of A/5 visa type, and not the number of persons who received a visa type A/5, and therefore, it is possible that for the data on a request approved for an A/5 type visa, there are other persons linked to the request who received A/5 visas.

B9c. the total of invited persons from Gaza and the West Bank who hold a visa type A/5 stands at 2,600.

West Bank - 2,196. Gaza - 404.

B9e. Of the requests in Section B8, 9,709 invited persons are foreign residents.
